Public Hearing Notice

The City of Macon will hold a public hearing on August 18, 2021 at 5:45 p.m. at City Hall located at 106 West Bourke, Macon, Missouri to discuss the city's submission of an application for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) COVID-19 program. The city is interested in obtaining all citizens' input on community development needs within the city. As part of the hearing process citizens will be asked to verbally assist in the completion of a Needs Assessment document. The document will detail what the residents feel are the strengths and weaknesses of the community. The city needs as much local participation as possible in order to reflect the true desires of the community as a whole, as well as the comments relating to the proposed project application. As a result of this funding no displacement of persons will occur.

The City is proposing to submit an application for the construction of a gravel holding lot at 501 Main Street, Macon, Missouri. The proposed project will include the demolition of the existing facility. The project is being submitted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic which has caused significant impact on the downtown area of Macon. The downtown area is currently a threat to the residents traveling in the area and the holding lot is necessary to remove the semi's in the downtown area of Macon.

The City proposes to contribute approximately \$30,000.00 in local cash, \$2,000.00 in in-kind services and CDBG funds are necessary in the amount of \$1,370,000.00 to complete the project. All citizens, including those in the targeted area, are encouraged to attend in order to comment on the proposed activities.
